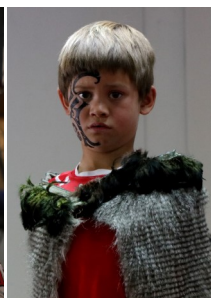
JUNIORS PERFORMING ARTS ROADSHOW
